



## ***Internship – Jaguar Ecology and Conservation in Emas National Park and surroundings***

### **Information about the internship:**

#### **☞ Housing:**

Housing for the interns has electric energy and a kitchen with stove and refrigerator. The interns are responsible for providing food and for clean-up. The housing area does not have telephone or cellular reception. There is no access to the internet. But there is a public telephone nearby 2,5 km.

#### **☞ Food:**

The interns buy food and prepare the meals themselves, with expenses divided among the interns. There is neither a cook nor a restaurant at the site. Food is bought in the small town nearby.

As the field work can take 6 – 12 hours daily, it is always good to carry snacks in the field.

Interns spend around US\$ 50.00 / month for food.

**PS: The interns are responsible for the food shopping. Interns must do the shopping on the first day, upon arrival at the nearest city.**

#### **☞ Terms of responsibility**

The Term of responsibility must be signed and given to the coordinators of the Project on the first day of the internship.

#### ☛ **Administration Fee**

An administration fee of US\$ 450.00 per month for January, February and July, and US\$ 250.00 per month for the other months of the year, must be given to the coordinators of the Project on the first day.

#### ☛ **Accident and Health Insurance**

Volunteers must have health insurance and insurance against work accidents during the period of the internship with the Project. A copy of the insurance policy must be given to the Project coordinators on the first day of the internship.

#### ☛ **Vaccines**

Vaccinations against tetanus and yellow fever are recommended.

#### ☛ **What to bring**

##### - **Material for the project:**

- 8 **small alkaline batteries\*** , size AA (for GPS);
- 8 **medium alkaline batteries\*** , size C (for camera traps);
- 1 paper film with 36 exposures (for camera traps);
- 1 box of rubber gloves, Size small or medium;
- Ziplock plastic bags (for scat collection)

\* The batteries must be alkaline for the equipment used in the Projects.

##### - **Personal Items:**

- Hat
- Sun Screen
- Insect repellent
- Bed sheets, bed covers, towels
- Warm clothes
- Field clothes (jeans, shirts, boots)
- Rain coat (especially from October until May)
- Lantern
- Working/gardening gloves (leather)
- Money for food, bus ticket, gas, etc.
